Go read about it! Then use it to mock up the following standard webpage scenarios (just in your `public.html`, no need for Rails for this):

- A navigation bar of links across the full width of the page (with the links centred on the page)
- A navigation bar of links down the left side of the page
- A gallery of image thumbnails with captions under them, but the gallery is neatly aligned and holds a variable number of elements across the page based on how wide the window is
- A short list of items (3?) that lines up across the page if it's wide enough, but switches to vertical when the window is narrower

What to use as content? Nonsense words and lorem ipsum are fine choices, but you might want to impose a little order on them so you can see what's going on.
